Once the professional is familiar with the definition and clinical information for a code, he/she may be able to readily assign the code without double-checking. (MDE, 2016)		On the web page for each condition, see the <b>Clinical Information</b> . There are several statements that describe the condition and its implications, some in highly technical terms and some in lay terms. The statements may assist you in describing a child's needs in your assessment for the Special Education Evaluation Report or in the IEP - Present Level of Academic and Functional Performance (PLAAFP). For example, here are two of several found for Generalized Anxiety Disorder.	

		<b>F41.1 Generalized anxiety disorder:</b> A condition marked by excessive worry and feelings of fear, dread, and uneasiness that last six months or longer. Other symptoms of gad nclude being restless, being tired or irritable, muscle tension, not being able to concentrate or sleep well, shortness of breath, fast heartbeat, sweating, and dizziness.	
		<b>F41.1 Generalized anxiety disorder:</b> Feelings of fear, dread, and uneasiness that may occur as a reaction to stress. A person with anxiety may sweat, feel restless and tense, and have a rapid heart beat. Extreme anxiety that happens often over time may be a sign of an anxiety disorder.
